- ❖ Most troops run with at least one co-leader or even a co-op troop where every mom takes a turn. **Additional parents help as troop Treasurer, Cookie Mom, and meeting helpers.**
- ❖ Most troops meet in public spaces about one time per month - you don't have to use your home!
- ❖ Medfield Girl Scouts offer town-wide activities that you can choose to participate in
- ❖ Medfield Girl Scouts holds "MGS Orientation" in June or September to introduce new AVGs to Girl Scouting in Medfield
- ❖ A Daisy Specialist is available to guide you through your first two years as an AVG
- ❖ Bi-monthly town AVG meetings with level break-out sessions let all the leaders get together to learn, share ideas and spread the work of planning great events.
- ❖ Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts (GSEM) offers training on a wide range of topics, much of it online!
- ❖ Girl Scouts USA (GSUS) publishes Journey program booklets and badge brochures that take you step-by-step through a meeting or even a year's worth of fun projects and activities.
- ❖ There are a ton of online resources as well, even "badge in a bag" kits!
